Equipment:

200 points will be awarded for Patrolling Equipment in accordance with Clubs individual Patrol Agreements.

20 points, to be deducted for each item not available as per Patrol Agreement (excepting those items which have been noted unavailable in the Patrol Log due to repairs etc). For example if there is meant to be 3 Rescue Boards, and only 2 are available with no note in the patrol log explaining why - this is a 20 point deduction, if only 1 is available then this is a 40 point deduction.

Patrol Uniform

100 Points will be awarded for correctly attired patrol members, with a 20 point deduction for each person incorrectly attired (All members registered to patrol excluding those wearing the orange cap for junior water safety are subject to inspection).

Specifically patrol members must be wearing:

- the red and yellow cap (unless special designated award holder),
- the DHL/Westpac Patrol Shirt and Patrol Shorts (unless involved in water activity)

*Note – members at a minimum are to be wearing bathers and the patrol cap – if a uniform is worn it must comply with the above.

Patrol Surround/DHL Shelter

100 Points awarded for having Westpac Surf Rescue Patrol Surround erected on beach.

100 Points awarded for having DHL Patrol Shelter erected above WESTPAC Surround.

Note: Should weather not be permitting, and the patrol is signed on as 'Inclement' with Surf Command, then 200 points will be awarded although these items are not erected – only if signed on as inclement.

Inflatable Rescue Boat

100 Points will be awarded for this area of patrol equipment.

20 points will be deducted for each item missing or not deemed serviceable*.

Note: Signals are to be completed prior to any scenario activity undertaken.
