For example if there is meant to be 3 Rescue Boards, and only 2 are available with no note in the patrol log explaining why - this is a 20 point deduction, if only 1 is available then this is a 40 point deduction.

Patrol Uniform

100 Points will be awarded for correctly attired patrol members, with a 20 point deduction for each person incorrectly attired (All members registered to patrol excluding those wearing the orange cap for junior water safety are subject to inspection).

Specifically patrol members must be wearing:

- the red and yellow cap (unless special designated award holder),
- the DHL/Westpac Patrol Shirt and Patrol Shorts (unless involved in water activity)
