## Patrol Equipment

200 points will be awarded for Patrolling Equipment in accordance with Clubs individual Patrol Agreements.

20 points, to be deducted for each item not available as per Patrol Agreement (except those items which have been noted unavailable in the Patrol Log due to repairs etc). For example if there is meant to be 3 Rescue Boards, and only 2 are available with no note in the patrol log explaining why - this is a 20 point deduction, if only 1 is available then this is a 40 point deduction.

## Patrol Uniform

100 Points will be awarded for correctly attired patrol members, with a 20 point deduction for each person incorrectly attired (All members registered to patrol excluding those wearing the orange cap for junior water safety are subject to inspection).

Specifically patrol members must be wearing:

- the red and yellow cap (unless special designated award holder),
- the DHL/Westpac Patrol Shirt and Patrol Shorts (unless involved in water activity)

There are a total of 10 signals, with 5 signals to be given by two people as selected.

Note: Signals are to be completed prior to any scenario activity commencing.

## Theory

- ✓ 2 x CPR (Resuscitation) papers to be completed by 2 separate persons (to be same person who are 1st and 2nd operators in practical assessment).
- ✓ 1 x ARTC paper to be completed by third operator in practical assessment.

A total of 200 points is possible – each question is worth 5 points.

# Resuscitation

No instructions will be given other than:

- ✓ Breathing/pulse present or absent
- ✓ For second and/or third operator to commence
- ✓ Cease activity

It will be expected for operators to determine time checks the end of a cycle etc, and all other forms of communication.

**Task Score range will be between 1 and 10, with a guide as below:**

10 = excellent; 8 = very good; 6 = good; 5 = average; 4 = below average; 2 = improvement required; 0 = not performed
